

Hilarious moment man takes 109-year-old Ford to a dealer for a service

Mechanics at a Ford dealership couldn't believe their eyes when a 109-year-old car arrived for a service.

The Ford Model T vehicle was first released back in 1908 and is known as being the first affordable automobile that made car travel accessible for middle-class America.

Two <u>YouTubers</u> took their own model of the <u>iconic</u> <u>car</u> for a spin but when they encountered problems, they decided to get them checked out.

Known online as <u>TFLclassics</u>, the duo uploaded a video to their YouTube channel where they documented their experience taking the century-old vehicle to a mechanic.

Noticing that the Ford needed an oil change, the pair took the car to an expert.





Once there the mechanic, Ray, revealed that the oldest vehicle he'd ever worked on was from the early 1960s. With the <u>YouTubers'</u> help, Ray got the car started by turning the archaic handle at the front of the motor.



After changing the oil, the mechanic inspected the vehicle and gave his expertise on it.

He said: "The biggest thing is we want to be sure our car is safe when it leaves so you'd probably fail those front tires.

When asked if he would send his wife out in the Ford Model T, Ray replied: "Well around the block, yes, on the highway, no."

After fixing up the car, the YouTubers let Ray take it out for a spin.

"It's definitely unique, first time driving one," the mechanic said from behind the steering wheel.



Viewers flocked to the YouTube comment section to share their reactions to the clip.

One user wrote: "The mechanic's smile when he had a chance to turn the handle and start the car was awesome. You could see it made his day."

Another said: "That Ford mechanic is so wholesome he seems so excited to be driving it. That's the best part of the video to me. Big ups to Ray."

A third person commented: "To see a working, fully functional Model T in this day and age that isn't in a museum and still driven is amazing."

And a fourth user added: "109 years ago, model T surprised everyone when it shows up in the country. Nowadays, the model T still surprises everyone driving around the country."

2025 Ford Mustang V8 Lineup Gets Notably More Expensive

The 2025 Ford Mustang ushers in the second model year of the iconic pony car's <u>all-new seventh generation</u>. It remains largely unchanged in terms of updates, which isn't surprising given its recent overhaul, but there is a notable difference in at least one aspect of the Mustang. Its price rose compared to the 2024 model as expected with a new model year. However, the steep increase in the cost of V8 engine models in particular is definitely noteworthy.



The least expensive of the Ford <u>5.0L Coyote V8</u> enginepowered 2025 Ford Mustang models is the GT, which starts out at \$45,560, not including the \$1,595 destination freight charge (DFC). That's an increase of \$2,700 compared to the 2024 Mustang GT, which was priced at \$42,860 to start.

The GT Premium trim also got a \$2,700 price increase for the 2025 model year, and it's no surprise to learn that the range-topping Dark Horse variants are also significantly more expensive than their 2024 model year counterparts. The "regular" Dark Horse now starts at \$63,380, reflecting a \$2,745 increase, while the Dark Horse Premium sees the largest price hike, starting at \$68,375 – up \$3,745.

Aside from pricing, there are a handful of minor changes on the way to the 2025 Ford Mustang. The <u>pony car loses four</u> <u>colors</u> that were available for the 2024 model year, although it does <u>gain two new hues</u>. Dual-zone climate control <u>is now standard fare</u>, while the <u>EcoBoost trims</u> <u>lose</u> the <u>2.3L High Performance Package</u> (HPP).

The 2025 Ford Mustang does gain the <u>60th Anniversary</u> <u>Package</u> in honor of its milestone anniversary, which can be fitted on GT Premium models in both coupe and convertible configurations along with either the six-speed manual or 10 -speed automatic transmission. This bundle adds a host of unique touches that pay tribute to the original Mustang, including special badging, stripes, a unique grille, 20-inch Dark Gravity Gray wheels, and <u>brings Brittany Blue</u> back to the exterior color lineup.



Production of the 2025 Ford Mustang began on November 4th, 2024 at the <u>Flat Rock Assembly plant</u>, as reported by *Ford Authority*.


